1. Minutes of the September 2017 Meeting

Moved by Lynn Ovenden/ Ted Farnworth that the September 2017 minutes be accepted with two corrections. **CARRIED**

2. Business arising from minutes

a) OFNC FY 2018 Draft Budget for Approval

Rémy asked Directors to remain aware of the significant deficit in the budget proposal, which he had earlier distributed as version 5. Two additional changes were requested:

- Jakob expressed reluctance to set a policy of giving honouraria to trip leaders given that the
 club does not recognize the contributions of other OFNC members with honouraria and, also,
 most nature clubs don't give trip leaders honouraria. Since trip leaders often do a scouting
 trip prior to their event, OFNC's gift might more rightly be a gesture of reimbursement for
 expenses. Directors agreed that the budget could authorize money for honouraria or
 reimbursement of trip leaders as determined by the Events Committee.
- Education and Publicity asked that the budget authorize two (not one) sponsorships to the Ontario Nature Youth Summit, as in other years.

Moved by Rémy Poulin/ Ann MacKenzie that the OFNC 2018 Budget, revised as discussed above, be approved. See Annex A.

b) Amending OFNC Funds

Further to the proposal to streamline OFNC's funds which the board discussed in September:

Moved by Rémy Poulin/ Ann MacKenzie that the General Reserve Fund be closed and the balance transferred to the General Fund.

CARRIED

Moved by Rémy Poulin/ Ted Farnworth that the Seedathon Fund be closed with the funds raised and spent being tracked by accounting codes. Any balance at the end of 2016-17 will be transferred to these new accounts.

Moved by Rémy Poulin/ Anouk Hoedeman that the Anne Hanes Memorial Fund be closed with the balance transferred to the General Fund.

CARRIED

Moved by Rémy Poulin/ Lynn Ovenden that the De Kirline Lawrence Fund be closed with the balance transferred to the General Fund.

CARRIED

Moved by Rémy Poulin/ Ann MacKenzie that the Martha Camfield Memorial Fund and the Macoun Baillie Birdathon Fund be merged into one fund called the Macoun Fund.

3. Communications

OFNC's president, Diane Lepage, wrote a letter to Governor-General Julie Payette inviting her office to continue its patronage of the OFNC.

4. Treasurer's Report

The year-end records are being assembled to send to the accountant by November 1, so that OFNC's year-end review may be prepared by December 1. Funds were withdrawn from an investment maturing in October to ensure there would be sufficient cash in the bank to meet our payment needs.

The Treasurer informed the Board that the tax receipt for donations is being changed. Instead of the small printed form accompanied by a letter, there will be a letter, signed electronically by the President, with the tax receipt at the bottom of the page signed in ink by the Treasurer. The letters will be modified to reflect the direction of the donation, either to the General fund, the FWG, Macoun, Seedathon or Safewings. They will also indicate if the donation was in memory of someone. Rather than all receipts being sent in January for the previous calendar year they will be sent out closer to the time of receiving the donation. This revision will also remedy the problem pointed out by the previous treasurer, Ken Young, that the receipts did not meet the current requirements of the CRA.

5. Issues for Discussion or Decision

- a) The annual Membership Report for FY 2017 shows there were 861 OFNC members on September 30, 2017, about 10% more than a year ago. Henry attributes part of the increase to the recent requirement of OFNC membership to gain access to the Shirley's Bay causeway.
- b) Henry asked Directors to re-consider the 3-year trial of granting free membership to families of

active Macoun Club members. Over the past 3 years, the families of 27 children were given a free family membership. One of those families now has a paid membership. Eighteen of the 27 families still have a child in Macoun Club, so they have had a free family membership up til now. Rob Lee asks that the policy be extended indefinitely.

Moved by Diane Kitching/ Jakob Mueller that OFNC continue to support young naturalists in the Macoun Field Club by providing free family membership in OFNC so long as the child is an active member of the Macoun Field Club.

c) Quick comments on topics discussed at the September BoD meeting
The authors of Birds of Nunavut were informed of the OFNC's decision to support the publication.
About 30 OFNC members will attend the unveiling of the plaque for James Fletcher.
The OFNC's sponsorship of Ontario Invasive Plants Conference was gratefully acknowledged; the talks and field trips were well-organized and full of useful information. A report on the conference is posted to the OFNC's blog.

6. New Business

- a) The international Lepidopterists' Society annual meeting will be at Carleton University July 11-14, 2018 followed by field trips on July 15, 2018. Registration will open by March 2018. Deadlines for abstract submission will be given then. OFNC may want to participate.
- b) The webmaster recently received a journalist's request to interview someone from OFNC regarding the lack of urban green space. This was a reminder of the difficulty of quickly finding a knowledgeable club member willing to respond to media requests.

7. Committee Updates

a) Birds

The committee met on Aug.28. The Seedathon happened and eBirders shared a list. The fall bird count will also be recorded on eBird with no in-person gathering afterwards.

b) Education and Publicity

Gord created a scavenger hunt pamphlet for visitors at FWG. Laura Maskell, whom OFNC sponsored to the Youth Summit, spoke to members at the October 10 monthly meeting.

Dave Seburn has completed the turtle road kill project and reported findings in a blog post.

Holly Bickerton has prepared an initial report on her project.

- c) Fletcher Wildlife Garden a potluck volunteer brunch is planned for late November.
- d) Events three leaders are needed for the 5d trip to Point Pelee in May. Leaders go for free.

f) Macoun Field Club

The club has 24 members. They have met twice already at FWG and had two field trips, to Pakenham and Stony Swamp.

g) Publications - The committee met on Oct.4.

h) Safe Wings

The list of committee members was distributed. They held their first meeting last week. With help from the Ottawa Ecotalent Network, they are working on a strategy for SafeWings. In order to provide advice on making new buildings safe for birds, they need better communications with local politicians and developers.

i) Ontario Nature

Two topics discussed at the recent regional meeting in Carp were 'executive renewal' and Ontario commitment to protect 17% of the land mass. Gord added FWG, Shirley's Bay and the Rideau River as sites on iNaturalist.
