## Meeting of the Board of Directors (BoD) of the Ottawa Field-Naturalists' Club Tuesday, October 22, 2019 – 7:00 p.m. Minutes

- 1. Approval of the Agenda approved as circulated.
- Acceptance of Minutes from September 2019
   Moved by Elizabeth Moore, seconded by Jakob Mueller, acceptance of the September, 2019 minutes. CARRIED
- 3. Business Arising from Minutes
  - a. Update on floor painting and carpet AAFC has advised that RC floor painting is not a priority. Eleanor has submitted a request for attention to some plumbing issues. Cleaners have advised that the carpet is not suitable for an industrial vacuum. A heavier duty carpet is required. The purchase of two rubber backed sectional rugs from Costco or Walmart was discussed. Action: Eleanor
  - b. Approval of the budget Ken tabled the budget proposal for the fiscal year beginning October 1 (attached). It has been updated with a new figure for FWG habitat expenses (now \$8,900), and a revised explanatory statement in the notes, from Annie, for the T&L budget.

**Moved by** Ken Young, seconded by Fenja Brodo, acceptance of the budget. **CARRIED** Diane thanked Ken for his efforts in this matter.

- c. Meeting with Marissa Croteau Museum of Nature (Diane): Diane, Anouk, Owen, Bev, Jakob and Sandy had attended this meeting. A useful discussion was had. Marissa will be getting back to us. The possibility of a 10% discount on Museum membership for OFNC members was discussed. Anouk would like to move her annual exhibition to the museum and possibly set up a long term display.
- d. Conservation Authorities Letter to government (Owen) Owen will send out a revised letter for approval and will submit it by email.

## 4. Communications

- a. Naturalists Newsletter Exchange Sandy had received an email from the President of the Toronto FNC expressing interest in connecting with other Ontario FNCs through sharing newsletters. The practical difficulties of sharing newsletters of different formats were discussed. **Action: Jakob will follow up with the President of the Toronto FNC.**
- b. Diane had received an invitation from Nature Conservancy Canada for two OFNC representatives to attend a reception before their NatureTalks Ottawa event featuring Les Stroud on Tuesday, November 5 from 5.30 p.m. to 7 p.m. at the Ottawa Art Gallery.
- 5. Treasurer's Report Ann noted that we are now in the new fiscal year 2019-20. There was a big surge in membership renewals as soon as Henry sent out the October 1<sup>st</sup> notices. This was particularly apparent on PayPal. Fewer people are using cheques.

Work is underway to finalize the package of documents for the accountants by the end of October. Part of this exercise is to provide an explanation when there is a significant difference between the actual amount and the budget and/or the previous fiscal year. This document could be shared with any Board members who wish it.

About 60 donation receipts with a thank-you letter have been mailed to all those who sent in a donation between April and Sept 30<sup>th</sup>. Bob Bergquist has been a big help in getting the letters prepared and keeping a database. We are sending bilingual letters for donations to the General Fund and Safe Wings. Donors to the FWG and Seedathon still get an English-only letter.

## 6. Issues for Discussion/Decisions

- a. Membership In response to a comment from Ken, Henry proposed that entities other than fee paying members, honorary members, life members and Macoun Club members should be recorded under a separate category. The BoD agreed this would be a more realistic way of presenting membership data.
- b. Jennifer McArton Gloucester High School request the BoD had been advised by Kevin Wallace of MacSkimming Outdoor Centre that an additional request for funds to attend the Centre could be accommodated within this year's budget. MacSkimming will contact her. It was noted that there is one more year left on the agreement with MacSkimming.
- c. Burnt Lands Alvar website Tineke Kuiper of MVFN would like to come to next month's meeting to discuss preservation of the alvar. Looking for input regarding educating the public about the alvar through their website. Action: Diane will invite Tineke Kuiper to the meeting.

## 7. Committee Updates

- a. Birds Bob: has circulated the Carp Barrens Phase Two Study Report. Awaiting the Phase Three report that will include recommendations. It was noted that there has been significant impact by public use, especially by mountain bikers. As a result of large quantities of junk mail, Bob and Michael Tate had removed their names from birds@ofnc and rarebirds@ofnc. Bob is now trying a gmail account. It was noted that both @ofnc addresses are being supported.
- b. Macoun Club Diane: older youth had a great time on a two-night field trip to Gerry Lee's cabin. An indoor meeting had focused on wild edibles and enjoyed some biscuits provided by one of the girls interested in this subject.
- c. Awards Eleanor: Awards Nominations period is open. There is a notice in T&L that has also been sent to Henry for email distribution and Sandy for the website. Eleanor asked the members of the BoD to give this matter their consideration.
- d. FWG Ted: most work has wound down. Awaiting leaves from landscape companies spreading leaves appears to be a deterrent for DSV. Two Health Canada groups did a lot of path work. Ted has asked a tree cutting company to sell FWG wood chips. End of season Pot Luck will be held on October 27. Bridge has been repaired problems not as serious as thought originally. Did add money to budget proposal for tree work. Owen & Ted have had a look at some of the trees that need removal. It will require a professional company to deal with this. Ted noted that a woman who organises volunteer led groups from ROH advised that groups are no longer likely to come from the ROH. Volunteers working with vulnerable populations are being discouraged by new requirement to pay for Police security checks. BoD agreed that security checks were not needed for volunteers with OFNC, with the exception of the Macoun Club Leaders.
- e. Conservation Owen: continues to be interested in *Rhododendron canadense* (rhodora), currently designated S1/SH (extremely rare or extirpated). Not found in spring at site Henry had seen it in the past. Contacted Paul Catling who has also found it previously but found construction at site of previous sightings. Contacted Natural Heritage Information Centre (NHIC) who advised that rhodora hasn't been reported for "decades". NHIC has said they will liaise with Owen/Jakob, following data sensitivity training, subject to a data sharing agreement. BoD agreed that Owen should be delegated authority on behalf of OFNC to enter into a data sharing agreement with NHIC with respect to rhodora. Owen, Diane, Lynn and Cheryl Bradley had visited South Nation Conservation Site 150 in the far east of Ottawa. A new red spruce (Acadian) forest was identified. They also identified an arrowwood new for Ontario.
- f. Events Jakob: November monthly meeting Keith Munro will speak about Chronic Wasting Disease. December meeting will be on microplastics. ABM January 14 Jakob will try to schedule some content after the ABM, as last year, to encourage members to attend. May try to highlight some recent conservation successes. Could possibly also roll over to Awards Night.
- g. Education & Publicity Gord: will be meeting October 24. They have a new member. One young person has been selected to be sponsored to go to the Ontario Nature Youth Summit.
- h. Ontario Nature Gord: Diane Lepage and Gordon Robertson attended the Eastern Ontario, Ontario Nature meeting held in Leeds and the Thousand Islands on 28 September. The meeting

was hosted by David Miller of the A2A Collaborative. This group presented what they have accomplished creating trails that connect Algonquin Park to the Adirondacks. One new trail that has been added connects Kingston to the main trails. Later we heard reports from the other groups present. One noteworthy presentation by David Stringer outlined the status of the cement plant proposal for the Vankleek Hill area. The Vankleek Hill and District Field Naturalist club has 19 members. The are fighting to prevent a plant that will sell cement to other countries using the port of Montreal. The club has limited resources and could use help to prevent the pollution that the plant will cause. It was decided to invite David to give his presentation to the OFNC club executive at its December meeting. **Action: Gord will make the invitation.** 

- i. Publications Annie: latest issue of CFN has been published with its new layout. Good feedback to the last issue of T&L. Submissions for the next issue would be appreciated.
- j. Finance Ken: nil else to report
- 8. Adjournment There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
