**Moved** by Ken Young, seconded by Diane Lepage, that the budget document distributed to the Board be accepted as the budget for the fiscal year 2021-2022. **CARRIED** 

**Moved** by Ken Young, seconded by Bob Cermak, that the Ottawa Field-Naturalists' Club authorize Jeff Skevington to execute a contract with a person or organization to assist with the Rare Birds Data Project. (The terms and conditions are described in the attached contract). **CARRIED** 

b) 2022 Nominations - Diane

Efforts to fill the vacant positions were discussed.

### 7. Committee Updates

- a) Awards Eleanor submitted the following report by email:
- "- the call for nominations for 2021 awards was announced in T&L, emailed to members in the NCR, and posted on the <u>ofnc.ca</u> banner (a thank you to Annie, Henry and Gordon, respectively). Nominations close on November 30.
- the framed award certificates for the 2020 awards were mailed to recipients recently."

The BoD discussed the publication of awardees names in OFNC publications and social media platforms. It was noted that some individuals were reluctant to be identified especially on social media. It was suggested that we should ask for permission in future. Jakob agreed to do this when notifying people about their awards.

- b) Birds Bob: nil to report
- c) Conservation Owen reported that he and Jakob had received an email immediately before the meeting from Nature Conservancy Canada which has entered into an agreement to secure additional lands (28 acres) in the Wolf Grove Provincially Significant Wetland near Almonte. The lands are being donated to the Nature Conservancy of Canada but they are fundraising for the transaction-related costs such as appraisal fees and a contribution to the Ontario Stewardship Endowment Fund that will enable them to steward the property. The total project cost is about \$45,000. They still need to raise about \$2,000 from donors and partners before the closing in November and are seeking support from OFNC. Owen confirmed that this is an environmentally significant area of land and recommended that OFNC consider helping with a donation. Ken suggested amending the donations line of the budget to allow for such donations.

**Moved** by Ken Young, seconded by Bob Cermak, that the OFNC donate \$1,000 to the Nature Conservancy of Canada to assist with expenses to secure additional lands in the Wolf Grove Provincially Significant Wetland.

The motion was opened for discussion and it was suggested that it should allow for a further \$1000 if necessary.

**Moved** by Eleanor Zurbrigg, seconded by Diane Lepage, that the motion be amended to allow up to \$1,000 in addition, if necessary, to achieve the objective.

d) Education & Publicity – Gord reported that they had hosted a number of beavers and cubs at FWG on September 25/26. Groups of 18 had been split into groups of nine and the event went very well. Almost all fall stories are up and they are also posting "newsflashes" about things of current interest on the boards. The Committee has two new members.

**Moved** by Gord Robertson, seconded by Diane Lepage, that Robyn Molnar and Jocelyne Boileau be approved as members of the Education and Publicity Committee. **CARRIED** 

- e) Events Jakob: nil to report
- f) Finance (see Budget under 6a. above) Ken: nil else to report
- g) Fletcher Wildlife Garden Ted had circulated the following report by email:
- "A dehumidifier has been purchased and installed in the FWG Resource Centre, to reduce humidity in the building particularly during the plant sale plant growing period
- A successful event "Back to Nature" took place on the FWG property on Thanksgiving weekend Sunday by the Canadian Parks and Wilderness Society (CPAWS)
- Contact has been made with the new events manager at Agriculture and Agri-food Canada. We have been assured that handling of requests for events proposed for the Fletcher by external organizations will continue as they have in the past. Only "complex requests" that involve larger groups, will impact on parking, will require toilet facilities, etc. will need to have Ag Canada approval. The Fletcher plant sale will not be affected.
- We have received notice from Ag Canada about possible problems with drinking water on the CEF. Recent changes to the allowable maximum concentrations of a variety of toxic materials in drinking water has prompted Ag Canada to initiate a verification that all potable water sources on the CEF (including presumably Building 138 The FWG Resource Centre) meet the new regulations. We have contacted Ag Canada for clarification of the status of the drinking water in Building 138.
- We will be shutting off the Back Yard Garden watering system shortly."

Eleanor confirmed that she had sent note to Robert Ranger regarding the drinking water but has not heard back.

- h) Macoun Club Diane K reported that they had held several field trips. The number of members attending have been fairly low but consistent, usually 4-8. They haven't decided what to do with respect to meetings over the winter. It is difficult to know whether there will be great enthusiasm for indoor activities now that school has started.
- i) Membership Henry is working on a job description for Membership Chair. Nil else to report.
- j) Ontario Nature Jakob reported that the October meeting had been held on Oct 2<sup>nd</sup>.
- k) Publications Annie noted that the next deadline for T&L is November 1<sup>st</sup>. She would welcome additional articles as she doesn't have a lot of items for the next issue.

I) Safe Wings Ottawa – Janette circulated the following report by email:

#### Communication

- Online outreach with the virtual event *When Worlds Collide* has been successful as virtual annual display and cross-Canada collaboration
- Global Bird week (Sept 27-Oct 3) tallies to be posted soon.
- Oct 24<sup>th</sup> is World Migratory Bird Day working on social media engagement
- Motion tabled Oct 8<sup>th</sup> to Ontario legislature by Fort York MPP Chris Glover to incorporate CSA bird friendly building design standards into the Ontario Building Code; SWO did social media campaign to have followers voice support

## **Operations**

- Phone system problems have subsided, but still exploring alternative providers for same type
  of service. Anouk is still manually transferring between shifts.
- YTD 2021: 1,181 birds admitted; 67% are collisions (up from 2020's 56%). Survival rate of approx. 90% after 24hr in care. SWO keeping collisions longer as most issues start arising after 24 hrs.

#### **Volunteer Activities**

- Virtual orientation sessions held in October
- Exploring 2<sup>nd</sup> software: Sign Up Genius; used by other rehabber, more user friendly with calendar overview
- LRT patrolling Hurdman, Lees OCTranspo staff know about Safe Wings and where to find the SWO bags. Outreach has proved effective!
- Have only 3 more phone volunteers from social media posts; have vacancies in schedule and need more support to free Anouk and Christina for growing rehab.

### **Events**

- Wild Outside walk (CWF) / patrol training held Oct 17, led by Janette.
- Real Property Institute of Canada's National Workshop abstract did not happen; inquiry made to see if still want SWO to submit an abstract

#### Advocacy

- Application for investigation at 200 Kent has been submitted. No updates, continue to push for action.
- KRP application forthcoming shortly.
- Good News: increase in new building applications (Gladstone village) which include provisions for bird friendly glass. City staff have been advocating and sharing information with applicants.
- City's Better Building Retrofit program deadline for recommendations to include in program is Oct 19th. SWO to petition inclusion of bird friendly design guidelines.

The "OFNC Rare Bird Data Project" will enter documentation of historically important rare bird sightings into eBird. This project will provide a permanent record of OFNC rare bird sightings on eBird for worldwide birders, science and conservation.
